
13 Villages in Washington, DC

- Total of 2,526 members, 688 active volunteers
- Mostly concentrated in wealthier neighborhoods
- Receive substantial funding from local DC government through its AAA



DC Villages' Collaborative Goals

- Improve policies, funding, and programs for older adults in DC
- Offer cross-Village programs and services to members of all participating Villages
- Help spread Villages and access to comparable services across
 DC
- Involve and serve a more diverse cross-section of DC's older adults
- Strengthen all DC Village Collaborative members

Challenges

- Fear of change: How will this affect our Village? Will we lose control?
- **Building consensus**: different Village sizes, budgets, structures (e.g., all volunteer vs. paid staff), *personalities*
- Re-thinking "Villages": Accepting that the classic Village model (paid members and local volunteers) might not work in every community

Identifying Partners

- Involved all Villages in the state for data collection and comment on documents
- All Villages were signatories on documents submitted to the state office on aging
- Collaborated with WAVE to communicate with Villages and engage mentor program

Strategies to Foster Village Development: Action

- The 2021 Virginia Joint Commission on Health Care recommended a grant program to develop and expand community-based organizations such as Villages.
- VVC 2023 proposal: A pilot program to expand and support Villages as a cost-effective strategy to complement and extend the work of AAAs and other community-based organizations in reaching underserved populations and combatting social isolation in older Virginians
